

Did you know that if you 'gift aid' your offertory donation and are currently a UK taxpayer, our parish can claim a further 25% without any cost to you? That means for every £5 you give we can claim an additional £1.25 from the government. It is a very valuable source of income to the parish. If you are new to the parish and have not yet had

the chance to explore gift aiding with us, or indeed if you are already giving regularly but have never joined the scheme, then please speak with Toby Cooper or Denise Wallinger who will be happy to help explain how to register and answer any questions you may have.

We kindly ask you all to register as a parishioner either via the web page: <u>www.caspar.church/me?ID=56071</u> or by scanning the QR code here (also available in the porch). You will need your own email address and will be prompted to create a password. The

sign-up process is simple, and we only collect your name and email address. Rest assured, all data is kept secure and is fully GDPR-compliant. You can delete your entry anytime you like. Scripture Reflections – Third Sunday of Advent Gaudete Sunday

This Sunday is called "Gaudete" Sunday. This Sunday the Mass begins with the Entrance Antiphon, "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always").

This Sunday we light the rose candle of the Advent wreath, and the priest may wear rosecoloured vestments, to express our communal joy in the coming of Jesus, as our Savior. Advent is a time for joy, not only because we are anticipating the anniversary of the birth of Jesus, but also because God is already in our midst. Christian joy does not come from the absence of sorrow, pain, or trouble, but from an awareness of the presence of Christ within our souls through it all.

Prophet Zephaniah 3:14-18a - In the first reading, the prophet Zephaniah says, "Shout for joy, O Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel." Zephaniah made this prophetic proclamation at the height of the Jewish exile when things appeared hopeless and unbearable.

In today's Responsorial Psalm, the prophet Isaiah instructs "Shout with exultation, O city of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel."

St Paul to the Philippians 4:4-7 - St. Paul echoes the same message of joy in the second reading, taken from his letter to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again, rejoice... The Lord is in your midst... Fear not... be not discouraged... The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all..." Paul was imprisoned when he made this appeal for rejoicing!

Luke 3:10-18 - In the Gospel this Sunday, John the Baptist explains the secret of Christian joy as a wholehearted commitment to God's Way lived out by doing His will. A sad Christian is a contradiction in terms. According to the Baptizer, happiness comes from doing our duties faithfully, doing good for others, and sharing our blessings with those in need. John challenges people to develop generosity and a sense of fairness, and to use these to give others reason to rejoice. John's call to repentance is a call to joy and restoration. Repentance means a change in the purpose and direction of our lives. Filled with joyful expectation that the Messiah is coming near, the people ask John, "What should we do?" He tells them to act with justice, charity, and honesty, letting their lives reflect their transformation. For us, that transformation occurs when we recognise that Christ has already entered our lives at Baptism and that His Presence is to be reflected in our living in the ways Jesus teaches.
